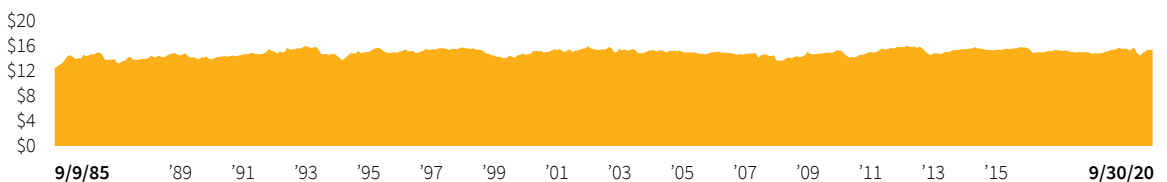

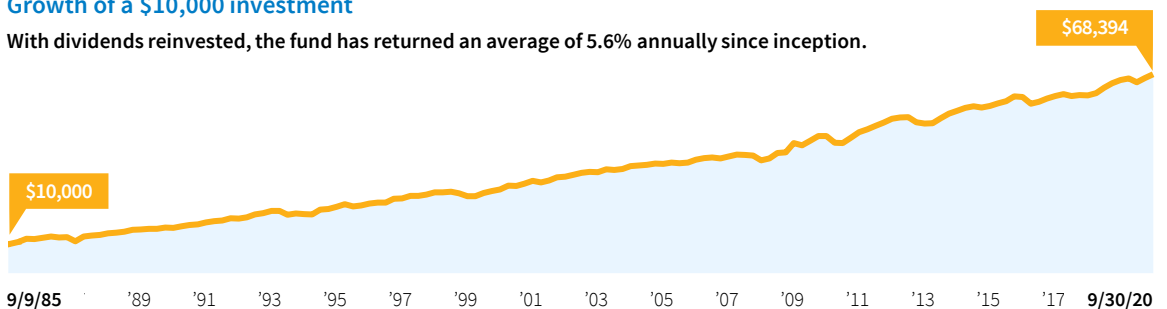

Average effective maturity

Option adjusted duration is the modified duration of a bond after adjusting for any embedded optionality.
