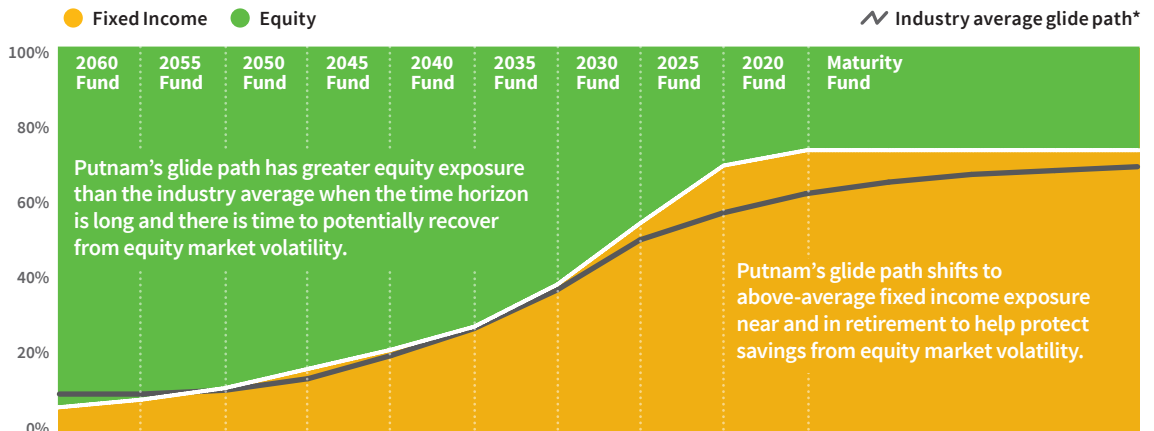

Each Retirement Advantage Fund has a different target date indicating when the fund's investors expect to retire and begin withdrawing assets from their account. The dates range from 2020 to 2060 in five-year intervals.
